The SymbioCity Trans Nzoia Working Group has realised that in order to deal with the waste management problem in Kiminini, physical interventions are not enough. There is also a need for awareness raising and training of different interest groups in the community.

Capacity building is therefore at the core of the quick win project, using methods such as door-to-door campaigns, clean-up days, establishing environmental clubs in schools, and training different groups of businesses depending on the type of waste they produce.

In addition to ambitious interactions with key actors in Kiminini, the project includes planting trees, installing waste bins (with separated compartments for organic and non-organic waste), purchasing two bulk bins that will fit the County's skip loader, installing benches, starting composting on a pilot scale, and encouraging the use of the road reserves for green businesses (mostly tree nurseries).

With benches to sit on, shade from trees, waste bins in every corner, and raised awareness of the individual's as well as the County's responsibilities for waste management, the project will take an important first step towards a greener, cleaner and more inclusive Kiminini.
